Presidential Guest Speaker Travis Tygart

Travis T. Tygart became USADA's Chief Executive Officer in September of 2007, and works closely with the USADA Board of Directors to carry out the organization's mission of preserving the integrity of competition, inspiring true sport, and protecting the

rights of clean athletes.

Under Tygart's leadership, some of USADA's most significant efforts to protect clean athletes have come in the form of major investigations. Working alongside federal authorities, USADA investigated the international steroid bust, Operation Raw Deal, and the international doping conspiracy involving the BALCO laboratory in San Francisco. Tygart also led the investigation into the U.S. Postal Service pro-cycling team doping conspiracy and spearheaded the publication of the Reasoned Decision in the Lance Armstrong case.

In addition to his work at USADA, Tygart currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Sports Lawyers Association and on the Board of Governors of the Partnership for Clean Competition.

Over the course of his career, Tygart has been recognized by *Sports Illustrated* as one of the 50 Most Powerful People in Sports, named to the *TIME* 100 list of Most Influential People in the World for 2013, and deemed one of the Top 12 World Sports Personalities of the Year by *Sport Intern*.

Dr. Paul F. Lachiewicz is the recipient of the 2023 L. Andrew Koman, MD Distinguished Southern Orthopaedist Award. He is a Consulting Professor in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery, Duke University Medical Center, and presently Attending Surgeon at the Durham VA Medical Center, with a career focus on total hip and knee arthroplasty. Dr. Lachiewicz was an AOA graduate of Cornell-Weill Medical School, completed his orthopaedic residency and fellowship at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York City, and was a Professor in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at UNC-Chapel Hill until retirement in 2009. He has been a member of the Southern Orthopaedic Association since 1985, and has served on the Board of Directors, as Program Chair, and then as President in 2011. Dr. Lachiewicz is a member of the Knee Society, International Hip Society, and was President of the North American Hip Society in 2015. He has over 200 scientific papers and book chapters, with special emphasis on clinical research on thromboembolism prophylaxis, total hip and knee revision surgery, and peri-operative pain management. He and his wife, Dr. Ave Lachiewicz have five grown children and 11 grandchildren.
