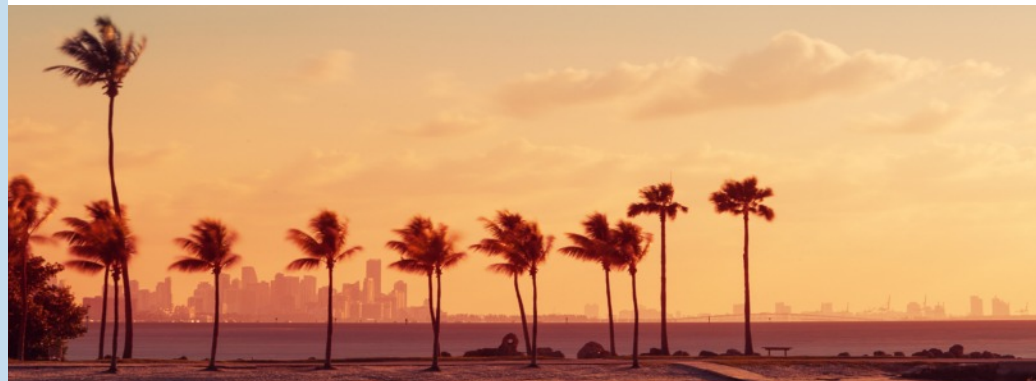

## 2024 L. Andrew Koman, MD Disti



### Chad T. Price, MD

Dr. Chad T. Price will be honored on Thursday as a recipient of the L. Andrew Koman, MD Distinguished Southern Orthopaedist Award. Chad, as he prefers to be called, graduated from Emory University in Atlanta, then Baylor College of Medicine followed by Orthopedic Residency at

University of Florida and a pediatric orthopedic fellowship at Scottish Rite Hospital in Atlanta. He practiced pediatric orthopedic surgery at Arnold Palmer Hospital for 36 years where he served as Director of Pediatric Orthopedic Education, and as a Professor of Orthopedic Surgery at University of Central Florida College of Medicine. For the last 12 years, Chad has managed The International Hip Dysplasia Institute at Arnold Palmer Hospital, which has funded numerous research projects while advancing research, education, and advocacy for the prevention and treatment of hip dysplasia in children and adults.

# Presidential Guest Speakers

## Robert L. Satcher, Jr, MD

Born in Hampton, VA, Dr. Satcher received his medical doctorate from Harvard Medical School, completed his internship and residency at the University of California, San Francisco, a post-doctoral research fellowship at University of California, Berkeley, and an orthopedic oncology fellowship at the University of Florida.



Prior to being accepted into the astronaut program by NASA, Dr. Satcher was the Assistant Professor at The Feinberg School of Medicine, Northwestern University, in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery.

Selected by NASA in May 2004, Dr. Satcher completed Astronaut Candidate Training in February 2006. During November 16-29, 2009, he was the first orthopedic oncologist to complete an orbit around Earth on the Space Shuttle Atlantis. He was also the first Black male astronaut and physician to act as the crew's medical doctor to the International Space Station. During the mission, he served as a mission specialist studying the influence of space on the immune system, specifically the effects of zero gravity on muscles and bone density. Dr. Satcher spent over 259 hours in space and participated in two of the three spacewalks, totaling 12hr 19min.



## Kevin Reilly

Kevin Reilly is an acclaimed inspirational speaker, author, former broadcaster for Philadelphia Eagles Network, and former professional football player. He has motivated thousands with his journey of overcoming illness and unbelievable obstacles.

Drafted by the Miami Dolphins in 1973, Kevin played for the Philadelphia Eagles, where he captained the special teams, and the New England Patriots. In 1976, Kevin was diagnosed with a desmoid tumor that led to a radical surgery to remove his left arm, shoulder and five ribs, ending his lifelong dream.

The procedure altered his body and life forever, forcing Reilly to end his professional football career and look at a new future, one with obstacles he never could have imagined. Through perseverance and strength, Kevin achieved accomplishments many thought impossible, seeing success in the corporate world, broadcasting, and reaching thousands with his inspirational message.

# Distinguished Southern Orthopaedists



## Peter F. Armstrong, MD

Dr. Peter F. Armstrong will also be honored on Saturday as a recipient of the L. Andrew Koman, MD Distinguished Southern Orthopaedist Award. He received his medical degree from the University of Western Ontario in 1972. His orthopaedic residency was done at the University of Toronto followed by a pediatric orthopaedic fellowship with Dr. Robert Salter at The Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto. Following his fellowship, in 1982, he joined the orthopaedic staff at The Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto but spent the first two years doing orthopaedic research at the University of Pennsylvania. In 1991, he then became Chief of Staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children Intermountain (Salt Lake City). In 2000, he was selected as Chief Medical Officer of the 22 Shriners Hospitals and moved to the Headquarters in Tampa. At the end of June 2012, he became the Chief Medical Officer – Emeritus.

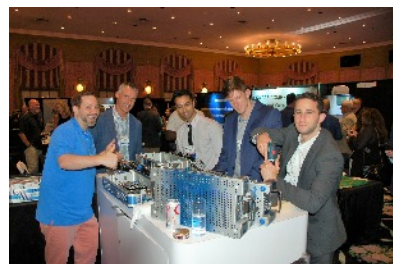
